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bad parents reflections on genesis by spencer bagwell an illuminating and nuanced deep dive into the first and possibly most well known book of the bible bad parents reflections on genesis invites us to question how both modern christian churches and popular culture present a version so at odds with the words as written full of flawed and often vindictive characters including a wrathful and unforgiving god how is genesis supposed to be interpreted how are present day christians to apply these stories to their own faith bad parents will guide the reader on a thought provoking journey through the pages of genesis and suggest how we might use it in our own lives screen time daycare praise sleep training spanking and time outs helicopter versus old school parenting there are a lot of questions facing parents of young children but consistent and reliable science based answers can be hard to find parenting made complicated written by child psychiatrist dr david rettew tackles many of the biggest controversies facing new parents today and examines the science behind these issues with writing that is lively personal non preachy and even funny this book doesn t assume that the correct answer for each parenting dilemma is the same for each child instead it describes how different approaches may be required based on a child s unique temperament or other important factors practical informed and entertaining parenting made complicated is a complete resource for parents and professionals alike who are looking for dependable information about today s parenting controversies the funniest book of the year are you sick of a society that seems obsessed with children do you find modern parents insufferable your children are boring is a uniquely humorous look at our culture s obsession with children a world where virtually every advert has a squawking child in it where pubs are full of wailing infants and where every other facebook post is tagged prouddad why do parents themselves behave like infants why having a child doesn t make you less selfish why it s extremely unlikely that your child is in fact special and why modern parenting is ruining everything not least the kids themselves all the answers lie within and it s your duty to read it yes your children are boring will make you laugh but it s much more than that once consumed you must take its teachings into the world and fix society or something oh and if you put dad or mum in your social media bios this book is aimed at you an excerpt from your children are

boring there are more radical solutions available to us of course i take my lead from the way we've societally turned smokers into pariahs at pubs let's create family areas in the pubs imagine roped off areas out the back covered in sick where the tables are made of plastic rather than wood soundproofed so we don't have to listen to you loudly slow talking or the baby crying or you could just go to mcdonalds which is where the kids want to be anyway and that's another thing does anyone think these kids want to go to a pub they're not renowned for their rides and pits of plastic balls but perhaps that's just a matter of time we'll inevitably infantilise getting smashed like we seem intent on doing to everything else you want it all don't you your spoilt little brain thinks i've had a child but that doesn't mean i should modify my life i still want pub so baby come to pub kids should be and probably are bored out of their tiny minds at pubs it's where grown ups go to bitch about their friends new kitchen or boyfriend girlfriend not a playground that's why they're full of glass fruit machines and sharp edges if we can be a little melodramatic though you're a virus you're ruining pubs like you ruined football and the cinema colonising it like the most boring invading army in history armed with iphones and kleenex the 55 age group in australia counts for 24 percent of the population and 56 per cent of the wealth abs however with greater wealth better health and longevity comes increased responsibility to help out young families especially when both parents have to work to make ends meet modern grandparenting is a comforting friendly and useful read for grandparents especially those who are feeling bewildered about the options available to entertain children in today's tech dominated world grandparents play a vital role in their grandchildren's lives children by nature are curious about the world and people around them as they grow older their level of awareness increases and questions begin to pour from their inquiring minds their questions maybe motivated by what they hear and see in their surroundings what they see on television or what they are trying to learn in school in most cases the burden of answering these questions falls on the parents parents are busy people children want the answers right now this guide will provide answers for concept in family law is undefined and often ambiguous yet to date more attention has been paid to how individuals acquire parental responsibility than to the question of the rights powers duties and responsibilities they have once they obtain it this book redresses the balance by providing the first sustained examination of the different elements of parental responsibility bringing together leading scholars to comment on specific aspects of its operation the book begins by exploring the conceptual underpinnings of parental responsibility in the context of parents and children s rights the analysis highlights the inherent constraints and limitations of parental responsibility and how its scope has deliberately been curtailed in certain contexts the book then considers what parental responsibility allows and requires in specific areas for example naming a child education religious upbringing medical treatment corporal punishment dealing with any contracts entered into or property owned by the child representing the child in legal proceedings consenting to a child s marriage or civil partnership and the law s response to the death of a child in the final section the idea of the responsible parent is considered in the contexts of child support contact tort and criminal law top family therapist diane levy gives clear parenting guidelines in this bestselling title this book presents a modern approach to parenting diane levy believes children must be taught to experience and handle their emotions and they must learn self discipline she also believes that it takes about twenty years to raise a child within that twenty years you will have taught or led your child towards the teaching of all the skills they will need to function in the world away from home levy s approach to parenting has two main tenets emotional support and limit setting the first responsibility of parents is to give children emotional support so that they will have the courage to have the experiences and do the learning that they need to become emotionally independent adults the second responsibility is to set suitable boundaries and expectations so that they can safely tread the path from undisciplined babies to self disciplined adults diane levy uses her approach to parenting in the context of modern society in many families both parents work and many parents work and raise children single handedly in order to establish a good family structure clear boundaries must exist between parent and child she discusses specific issues such as sibling rivalry bullying and nasty habits readers may dip into the book to find immediate help for problems with sleeping eating and toilet training sex education and strategies for coping with teenagers are also covered with the last part of the book summing up simple parenting strategies parents often disagree with their children over their choice of partner although the reasons may vary the outcome is very often one of conflict a conflict peculiar to the human species for the first time in one volume sexual selection under parental choice employs an evolutionary perspective to understand this conflict and explore its implications covering recent developments in the field of evolutionary psychology menelaos apostolou reveals the extent of parental attempts to control the mating decisions of their offspring and investigates the qualities parents seek in prospective in laws children s attempt to escape this control can lead to practices such as foot binding and clitoridectomy or in postindustrial societies more subtle forms of coercion and manipulation apostolou demonstrates that much of human mating behavior has been shaped by parental choice and that parents have a significant influence in sexual selection the traits they favour in their children s mates are selected and increase in frequency in the population sexual selection under parental choice will be ideal reading for researchers and advanced students of evolutionary developmental and social psychology as well as other related disciplines such as social anthropology sociology and the biological sciences this book focuses on the background migration and settlement of new migrants in china it also examines the status of their social networks the role of urban society social security and future planning based on semi structured interviews the book analyzes these aspects of new urban migrants and argues that intellectual migrants with their strong educational background are willing to engage in urbanization and have clear entry strategies labor migrants find it is challenging for labor migrants to receive the same welfare as citizens and they are subject to significant segregation in urban societies due to existing policies and market economy conditions operational migrants have stronger settlement and family oriented tendencies compared to labor migrants an inspiring and practical book by a veteran high school
