a study Deere of the influence of german chief of staff helmuth von moltke 1906 1914 a second edition of this leading introduction to the origins of the first world war and the pre war international system william mulligan shows how the war was a far from inevitable outcome of international politics in the early twentieth century and suggests instead that there were powerful forces operating in favour of the maintenance of peace he discusses key issues ranging from the military public opinion economics diplomacy and geopolitics to relations between the great powers the role of smaller states and the disintegrating empires in this new edition the author assesses the extensive new literature on the war s origins and the july crisis as well as introducing new themes such as the Owners relationship between economic interdependence and military planning with well structured chapters and an extensive bibliography this is an essential classroom text which significantly revises our understanding of diplomacy political culture and economic history from 1870 to 1914 a history of the near simultaneous emergence of Deere moving pictures in several countries in the mid 1890s and a thorough reevaluation of the development of the technology choice outstanding academic book 1999 the first book to put brits in their places genetically shattering the myth of anglo saxon roots and redefining celtic identity unpublished mtdna and y chromosome genetic data has rapidly piled

up about the british people synthesising the new genetic evidence with linguistics archaeology and history stephen oppenheimer breaks dramatic findings about the origins of the british peoples the first scoop is that the roots of english identity lie over 6000 years ago not with the anglo saxons the anglo saxon invasion contributed only 5 10 of male english genes instead the genetic evidence reveals that the majority of english people derive directly from before the first farmers secondly new genetic findings finally answer the question of celtic genetic identity the putative origins of the celts is an issue real for millions of people from sore lunged glasgow football fans to the refined celtic diasporas of north america and australia gene lines prove once and for all the continued existence of a discrete british atlantic coast based population that first spread north from the basque country at the end of the last ice age not iron age europe the division between england and the atlantic fringe started to build up from that time finally oppenheimer puts new detail on the genetic legacy of the viking invasions he reveals that orkney and shetland far from being victims Manul had been part of the scandinavian world long before the viking onslaught and through the evidence of their genes participated actively in raids on ireland and the colonization of iceland this book argues that conflicts over slavery and abolition in the early american republic generated a mode of constitutional interpretation that remains powerful today the belief that the historical spirit of founding holds authority over the current moment simon j gilhooley traces how debates around the existence of slavery in the district of columbia gave rise to the articulation of this constitutional interpretation which constrained the radical potential of the constitutional text Owners to reconstruct the origins of this interpretation gilhooley draws on rich sources that include historical newspapers pamphlets and congressional debates examining free black activism in the north abolitionism in the 1830s and the evolution of pro slavery thought this book shows how in navigating the existence of slavery in the

district and the fundamental constitutional issue of the enslaved's personhood antebellum opponents of abolition came to promote an enduring but constraining constitutional imaginary a synopsis of the bura project the three major rationale for writing this book are primarily to through the study of african language family groups trace the origin of the tribe to a more specific location rather than the diffused response of from the east secondly to investigate why and how the word pabir babur came on the scene referring to a separate ethnic group different or the same as the bura and thirdly to document some of the vanishing bura cultural practices Manual and deeds for example what their beliefs are their marriage practices local industries and what they do to pass time it is my strong belief that the first objective is accomplished through our analysis and presentation of the proto afro asiatic linguistic family classification group and its subgroup the proto chadic of which the biu mandara forms a sub branch through a systemic and vigorous study of the classification of the different languages comprising this proto family of languages and its sub branches we are able to assert that the bura people were among many other ethnic groups part of a group whose origin can be traced to the levant region of south west asia and the middle east they belong to the group that forms back to africa migration this is because modern genetic studies of languages indicate that they re the only group that have traces of y chromosome belonging to haplogroup r1b r v88 in africa but found mainly in asia and europe after tracing the influences of the powerful kanem ca 700 1376 and later bornu kanem 1380 1893 empires around the lake chad region as well as the kingdom of mandara founded in about 1459 i e end of the 15th century in what is today modern cameroon on the inhabitants of the region we conclude a chaotic period of migrations and wars including trade in slaves it is through this prism that we notice the emergence of the founder of the woviri dynasty of biu through his failure to win the maiship of bornu he moved to mandara and then the plateau of biu

with some of his followers or relatives being a student of history abduwali or who later became yamta ra wala attempted to replicate what the kanembu were able to do among the local people they conquered some centuries earlier they created an ethnicity and language called kanuri yamta ra wala succeeded somewhat but wasn't able to completely conquer the bura people and turn them in his new ethnic vision instead the buras went to the hills to fight him the next day the new breed he created he called pabir or babur as the hausa would call them the myth of who yamta ra wala is has for the present eclipsed historians and would probably continue for some time to come as for the bura most have down the hill tops and mountains and the pabir they have never been closer than today today for all practical purposes they are one and the same ethnic group they've intermingled more than any two previously separated groups their vocabulary phonology and cultural practices have fused into one in most instances this is an account of the nation's first intelligence agency the office of special services o s s how it operated what it accomplished and how it laid the basis for the present central intelligence agency and how its charismatic founder wild bill donovan established control over it recruited its staff and most importantly sold roosevelt the armed services the allies and the rest of the country on the agency's varied and often bizarre shadow warfare missions during world war ii the o s s's special relationship with the british the key role of academics and its embarrassing connection with the soviets n k v d are also addressed smith concludes that the creation of the c i a after the war owed less to the accomplishments of the o s s than to donovan's public relations skills and the precarious military situation the country found itself in at the time mr smith has done an exhaustive job of john research on the o s s and donovan the book offers an honest lively portrait of an important american and the contributions good and bad that he and the o s s made to the american intelligence system much of this book can be read for the pleasure of

He asks many important questions: why did the cause of peace advance in the 1920s only to be stopped in its tracks and threatened with reversal by the Great Depression? What was the nature of Nazi thinking about war, foreign policy, and the policy of appeasement that sought to accommodate the Third Reich without again going to war? This book has developed from a study that was first undertaken a number of years ago when Howard Mumford Jones, then editor in chief of the John Harvard Library, invited me to prepare a collection of pamphlets of the American Revolution for publication in that series. The full bibliography of pamphlets relating to the Anglo-American struggle published in the colonies through the year 1776 contains not a dozen or so items but over four hundred. In the end I concluded that no fewer than seventy-two of them ought to be re-published but sheer numbers were not the most important measure of the magnitude of the project. The pamphlets include all sorts of writings: treatises on political theory, essays on history, political arguments, sermons, correspondence, poems, and they all display all sorts of literary devices. But for all their variety they have in common one distinctive characteristic: they are to an unusual degree explanatory. They reveal not merely positions taken but the reasons why positions were taken. They review motive and understanding, the assumptions, beliefs, and ideas, the articulated worldview that lay behind the manifest events of the time. As a result I found myself, as I read through

this book intended for students of spiritual science can lead to a profound awakening to the challenges that face humankind today the origins of music was first published in german in 1911 in this text carl stumpf set out a path breaking hypothesis on the earliest musical sounds in human culture alongside his research in such diverse fields as classical philosophy acoustics and mathematics stumpf became one of the most influential psychologists of the late 19th century he was the founding father of gestalt psychology and collaborated with william james edmund husserl and wolfgang köhler this book was the culmination of more than 25 years of empirical and theoretical research in the field of music in the first part stumpf discusses the origin and forms of musical activities as well as various existing theories on the origin of music including those of darwin rousseau herder and spencer in the second part of the book he summarizes his works on the historical development of instruments and music and 4710 studies a putatively global range of music from non european cultures to demonstrate the psychological principles of tonal organization as well as providing a range of cross cultural musical transcriptions and analyses this became a foundation document for comparative musicology the elder sibling to modern ethnomusicology and the book provides access to the original recordings stumpf used in this process the origins of music is available for the first time in the english language as a result of a collaboration between the european society for the cognitive sciences of music escom and oxford university press it is a fascinating volume for all those with an interest in the history of psychology and music it appears here in tandem with self portrait stumpf s autobiography of 1924 in which he outlines the rich life experiences behind his research career alongside his own explanation of his scientific and cultural legacy new york times bestseller fascinating men s health best beach reads for sports fans on the origins of sports is an illustrated book built around the original rules of 21 of the world s most
